Learning outcomes: The subject EU Administrative Law will provide students with a general knowledge of EU administrative law and specific legal documents that have an impact on the creation of the legal framework of EU administrative law. Within the course, there is also the intention to provide students with information about selected special types of proceedings. Following the acquired knowledge, students will solve specific case studies. The result of the teaching process should be the ability of the student to apply the acquired knowledge in solving specific cases arising from the practice.
