The presented project has a standard arrangement and respects the formal and citation criteria as well as the principles of referring to primary and secondary literature. The goal of the doctoral project is to clearly, succinctly and accurately characterize the subject of the dissertation. It also includes elaborated sub-goals that condition the achievement of the main goal. The project does not lack discussion, as well as its results. The author's own attitudes and solutions arrived at are logically organized and sufficiently evaluated. At the same time, the doctoral student can comment on all facts and knowledge in confrontations with the results of other authors or case law. After graduation, the doctoral student is able to present, argue partial results of scientific research and lead a professional discussion regarding the issue in question.
